the Bedke farm and they were still making it thier home.

After he had harvested his crops in the fall of 1941, he moved with his family to Elba where he helped run his father's farm. It was during this time that he was a councilor in the M.I.A.

In the latter part of Sept., 1942, he decided to go ahead of his family to Utah to see if he could find employment. He got a job at the Murray Smelter, Murray, Utah. Housing was short because of the war and the only place he could find to live was at the Utah Motor Park where his family joined him on Oct. 1, 1942. Later in the fall he was able to rent two rooms of a house at Sandy, Utah and he lived there until Sept. 1943 when he made a down payment on a 2 room home at 4869 So. Boxelder St. in Murray.

During his term of employment at the Murray Smelter the plant was shut down a number of times for periods of several months and during these shutdowns he was transferred to the Garfield Smelter. He had no choice in this matter because of wartime restrictions.

In the past 8 years he has had several different jobs in the Lark the Lark mine. He began as a mucker and has worked as a timberman, slusherman, miner, shaft repairman, cage rider and hoistman. He has been active in his local union, feeling that he should take an active part in the organization that had so much control over his temporal welfare. He has served as recording secretary of the union since 1946 and was on the negotiating committee (which works out contracts with the company) during 1950-51-52. He has also been for several years a committee member of a local civic organization known as the Lark Athletic Committee which provides social activities for employees of the mine and residents of the town. In 1953 he was elected president of this committee. He has also been Grievance committees and welfare committees connected with mine activities.

He has been active in the Church, having served in the Sunday School Supt. for seven years. He was released from this job to become the Ward Clerk in charge of finances and Senior Aaronic Priesthood advisor. He has also been instructor of the Elders class for about five years. He was ordained a Seventy by Elder Bruce R. McComkie in May, 1952.
